Reporting Procedures Parents / Guardians

If a parent/guardian has a potential safeguarding concern about their child /a child /young person /adult at risk and in need of protection and have reason to believe that they are suffering from abuse, they should in the first instance contact the college Safeguarding Team. This should be done immediately by emailing <u>safeguarding@belfastmet.ac.uk</u> or telephone 02890265019. The Safeguarding Team will instigate the college safeguarding procedure.
