

Guidance for Students



Everyone has a role to play in keeping our College safe and in helping to stop the spread of COVID-19.

You should book a COVID-19 test if you have:

Don't come into College if you have COVID-19 symptoms.

Visit **nidirect.gov.uk/coronavirus** to book a test online. Call 119 if you cannot book a test online.

A high temperature

This means you feel hot to the touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature).

A new continuous cough

> This means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).

A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

> This means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

If you do not have symptoms of COVID-19 but have other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, you do not need to be tested and you or members of your household do not need to self-isolate. You can attend College if fit to do so.

You have **COVID-19 symptoms**

What should you do?

- Do not come into College
- Let your course tutor know straight away
- Book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform College immediately about test result.

You test positive for COVID-19

What should you do?

- Do not come into College
- Inform course tutor immediately about test result
- Self-isolate for at least 10 days as advised by PHA.

Somebody in your household has COVID-19 symptoms

OR

What should you do?

- Do not come into College
- Let your course tutor know straight away
- The household member should book a COVID-19 test
- Household self-isolates
- Inform course tutor immediately about test result.

When can I return?

You can return to College if the symptomatic household member's test is negative providing you are well enough, have not had a fever for 48 hours and if you haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

Somebody in your household tests positive for COVID-19

- Do not come into College
- Inform course tutor immediately about test result.

When can I return?

You can return to College if the test is negative providing you are well enough, have not had a fever for 48 hours and if you haven't been advised to self-isolate by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

When can I return?

You can return to College after 10 days even if you still have a cough / loss of smell or taste. These symptoms can last for a few weeks.

When can I return?

You can return to College when you have completed 14 days of self-isolation without any symptoms.

Contact tracing has identified me as a close contact

What should I do?

- Do not come into College
- Let your course tutor know straight away
- Self-isolate for at least 14 days as advised by the PHA Contact Tracing Service.

When can I return?

You can return to College when you have completed 14 days of self-isolation without any symptoms*.

I have been in contact with someone who has been identified as a close contact

What should I do?

- Come into College as normal
- If you do not have any COVID-19 symptoms, you should carry on with normal activities.

I have travelled abroad and have to self-isolate

What should I do?

- Do not come into College
- Let your course tutor know straight away
- Self-isolate for 14 days in line with quarantine advice.

*If you have been identified as a close contact of a case of COVID-19, or have returned from travel abroad and are self-isolating, you must self-isolate for 14 days even if you have had a negative COVID-19 test result.

When can I return?

You can return to College when you have completed 14 days of self-isolation without any symptoms*.
